Using methods of developing trust through communication, Monty Roberts "The Man Who Listens to Horses" helps troubled youths to get a handle on their lives and become successful adults.

Monty Roberts, horse gentler and New York Times best selling author, gained international fame by developing a method of communicating with horses using their natural body language, a technique he calls Join UP. Founded on a consistent set of principles, communication and trust, Monty's methods assert that violence is never the answer. When Monty learns that the lives of the wild horses of Palm Island are being threatened by local youths, he flies to Australia to help save them.

A victim of child abuse himself, Monty sees an opportunity to share a message of hope, learned from horses, with these children who have been raised in one of the most violent places on earth. Witness the positive changes that come over these troubled youth of Palm Island as they work with Monty and the horses to create a bond of trust.
